Friendship in the Break

(Luke 24: 13 - 35)

Church people use a lot of religious language to describe what we believe in: salvation, resurrection, communion. But in our rituals, we use very familiar signs to explain what me mean by all this. Eucharist is one of these. Oh, for the pleasure of a meal with friends!

Friendship is a kind of sacrament all its own. We share histories with our friends. We tell the story of our lives and find common ground. And when we come together, we share food. The warmth and comfort of a meal reflects the nature of our relationship with one another. We celebrate the union of our hearts around the table.

In the unique gathering of our Eucharist, we also acknowledge the great story of our God and our relationship with the Holy One through Jesus Christ. Our eyes are opened in this meal to recognise the common ground we hold with divinity: the reign of God itself. Our relationship with God through Christ is true yesterday, today, and forever. This is what our faith means. Everything we need to know about God is in this meal.

Pray

God who journeys with us, Jesus is our companion who journeys with us. May Jesus keep breaking for us the bread that gives us courage and open our eyes to recognise him in our downhearted and suffering brothers and sisters. Amen.

Ponder

Prepare a special meal for someone you care about. Entertain the Holy One in the breaking of the bread. Think of a meal you recently shared with friends or family. What does it teach you about the meaning of Eucharist?

Kids' Corner

Two disciples are walking along and talking with Jesus, but they don't realise it's him. Once they get to their destination, they invite him in for dinner and they finally recognise him. Their eyes are opened! You might be thinking, "If I were walking and talking with Jesus, I'd know it was him". But really, Jesus is in everyone, every day. Do you recognise Jesus in your friends and family? How about the classmate you don't like, or the kid who's always alone at lunch? Jesus is there.

Children's Liturgy, for children in preschool to year 6, will recommence at the 9.30am Sunday Mass on 7 May. Held during 9:30am Mass throughout school term, Children's Liturgy presents the Sunday readings and Gospel to children through prayer, discussion and activities.

We are seeking additional parishioners to join our Children's Liturgy Team as a coordinator, teacher or helper. An outline of these roles follows:

Children's Liturgy Coordinators:

The coordinator is responsible for contacting teachers prior to the weekend, ensuring the Parish Centre, used for children's liturgy is ready prior to Mass, helping the children as they walk out of the

church, collecting the classes at the appropriate time, and after Mass, returning the materials to the storage area.



Parents of young children are invited to lend their support. You may like to start as a helper before becoming a teacher. This role includes reading the Gospel and talking to the children about the Gospel and supervising the children in their activity. All readings and materials are provided.

Who doesn't love a road trip? Families tell of their adventures on a summer holiday; friends talk of their escapades while travelling to warmer climates on the winter break; strangers bond during the harrows of a routine trip going awry.
