Blessed Eyes, Blessed Ears

(Matthew 13: 1 - 23)

My Dad's hearing started to fail. My vision has gotten to the point where I need two kinds of glass in my glasses. Our senses have a built-in obsolescence that we ignore till they balk and we find out there's no warranty.

Seeing and hearing are gifts not to be taken for granted, but understanding with the heart is greater still. Jesus never blames the blind man for his blindness, nor a deaf person for not responding. But he does have a lot to say about people who walk wide-eyed into episodes of sin. Jesus is blunt with religious people who refuse to change their hearts. They (we!) enjoy the advantage of having God's word sown like seed in our soil, and yet nothing is cultivated and nothing grows. No plot of ground is responsible for its barrenness if the seed never arrives there. But woe to the ground that's planted and yields dust! Far better to stop going to church and stop calling ourselves Christian, than to adopt the name and go on, deaf and blind to Jesus.

Pray

Ever-present God, bless us now as we open ourselves to these stories – stories that are sometimes difficult and which hold tensions, lies, and rivalry. May we wander through them with a heart open to the ways that your presence, truth, and love is near. Amen.

Ponder

Make a commitment to God's word. Get a readable Bible – it may not be the big leather one in the living room. Spend ten minutes a day, on one passage or even one verse. Make a commitment reasonable enough to see through. "That's why I tell stories: to create readiness, to nudge the people toward receptive insight".

Kids' Corner

Seeds grow best in rich soil. Yet, the sower in this story doesn't just plant in good ground. He flings seeds into rocks, thorns and right on the path where travellers walk. Instead of waiting for a just-right spot, he scatters his seed everywhere. God's love is a little like that. God doesn't wait for us to be perfect. God pours love into us just as we are, ready or not.

Plastic Free July

Let's think of a couple of ways we can change old habits re the use of plastics. Sometimes it's not easy because we are often time poor but with a little bit of thought and creativity, we can change our behaviour and recycle, re-use and reduce our reliance on single-use plastic. Here are just a couple of ideas....



Beeswax wraps.

They are eco-friendly food covers available from craft markets, health food shops and if you are interested, a couple of parishioners make them for sale. They last up to about 12 months and are biodegradable and compostable.

Lunch wrap and paper bags

It could be called 'old fashioned' but if you're not using beeswax wraps, why not use paper lunch wrap (comes in a roll) and place sandwiches for work in a brown paper bag. Question – does anyone take sandwiches to work anymore?

Invitation to Become a Mentor

You are invited to express an interest to become a RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) mentor.

A mentor serves as a guide and example to someone seeking to become Catholic by accompanying them in friendship and with prayer, the mentor introduces the person to how Catholics live and practice our faith. The primary role of a mentor is to offer a welcoming spirit by:

- Inviting the candidate to sit with you and your family at Mass
- ♦ Showing them around the parish
- Introduce them to your parishioner friends
- Encourage them to get involved in ministry and parish life such as morning teas, events etc.

Mentors are not expected to have theological knowledge to provide the candidate with any teachings.

Mentors will be paired with someone who has expressed an interested in becoming Catholic at our Parish.

No prior training or experience required as mentors will receive ongoing support and formation from Fr Troy.

Who can be a mentor?

- ♦ Anyone who has been fully initiated in the Catholic Church; and be a practicing and participating member of the parish community.
