(Matthew 18: 15 - 20)

When I respond in anger and treat someone unfairly, I want to be justified, not reproved. But some of my friends love me enough to tell me when I'm way off base and need to examine my motives. Sometimes it's enough to hear it from one person. Sometimes, I need to hear it from every direction before I'm ready to change. I value this honesty in my life because I can't always punch my own way out of ignorance. My friends know how dearly I want to hear yes in heaven, so they're willing to say no to me in the here and now.

Have you ever corrected someone you love when they're in error? How do you respond to such correction?

Pray

Compassionate, loving God, every day we see and hear the misery and suffering of oppressed people. Too often, we do not allow ourselves to be your partner in their liberation. Call us. Empower us. Consecrate us. Send us. Amen.

Ponder

Spend a week mindful that you're God's special agent of grace for others. Wear a cross or display a Bible phrase on your desk to act as your badge of commission. Let love be the goal of your words and actions.

Jesus keeps his promises. So, when Jesus tells us he will be with us, we can depend on Jesus. That's good to know, isn't it? As Jesus' followers, shouldn't we try our best to be with others too? Especially those in need? Maybe you're wondering how you can do that. Here's one way. Is there someone you know who needs Jesus' help? Maybe they are sick, sad, lonely or even angry. Find a friend or family member and invite them to pray for this person with you. Pray together in Jesus' name and remember that Jesus is there with you.

Introducing the Season of Creation

The Season of Creation commenced on 1 September – the World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation – and ends on 4 October – the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology.

The Season of Creation is an ecumenical celebration of God's creation. Throughout the month-long celebration, the world's 2.2 billion Christians come together to care for our common home.

This season is a time for prayer and contemplation about the issues facing our planet and everything that lives on it. The Vatican is asking us to use the Season of Creation to increase understanding of the challenges facing our world, most critically in impacts on our climate, on biodiversity, on water supply and pollution.


Pope Francis sees that there is now an urgent challenge for humanity to look after the earth, the poor and the next generation.

This year's theme for the Season of Creation is Let Justice and Peace Flow. Its image is of a mighty river and is inspired by the words of the prophet Amos – "Let judgement flow like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (Amos 5:24).

In his message about the World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation the Pope says that we need to *make 3 transformations* if we are to join the mighty river that allows justice and peace to flow. Over the next 3 weeks we will look at these transformations to see what we can all do to be a part of the change that is necessary.

The first of these transformations is to transform our hearts to join the mighty river. The Pope quotes Saint John Paul II, who said that we need to embrace the renewal of our relationship with creation so that we no longer see it as an object to be exploited but cherish it instead as a sacred gift from our Creator.

We hope that parishioners will join us in celebrating the Season of Creation. One practical way of doing that is to join in a **Community Planting day next weekend**, **16/17 September**, **in the Parish Community Garden**, where you can join with other parishioners in learning about some practical things that will care for creation.

From the Parish Council

The Parish Pastoral Council met this week for the monthly meeting. The agenda covered the Parish Finances, Youth and Young Adult Programs, and the planning for the 30th Anniversary celebrations.

Peter from the Parish Finance Committee spoke to the Council about the Parish's financial position from last year and what it looks like in the coming year. The figures we discussed were presented in the Parish Bulletin on 29/30 Jun 2023. It was an insightful discussion. Key in the discussion is we have predicted an about \$20,000 reduction in income for the coming year compared to last year. We are managing expenses at the moment but increasing costs for our large parish and changes in diocese insurances are creating additional pressures on our Parish budget. In the coming year we will be monitoring our financial progress and probably looking to refresh our fund raising efforts. Please stay tuned.

We have made remarkable steps in connecting and fostering the youth and young adults this year. Through Fr Eden's drive and leadership, we have four programs in the Parish. Morning Beans, an early morning Mass and coffee catch up each Friday for young adults. A monthly men's group for young men looking for spiritual and personal connection as they navigate the highs and pitfalls in life. A young adults Alpha group to promote faith and reach those who have not connected with church or looking to reconnect. The last initiative is the youth group which continues to be refreshed, not only by Fr Eden but by Matthew Allen and Frances Dinn. Each of these programs are growing and like the mustard seed will continue to grow with your prayers and support. These programs give us a head start in getting more pilgrims to World Youth Day 2026. So this weekend please pass on your words of support to Fr Eden, Frances, Matthew and Malwyn our youth minister.



The finally and most significantly the Council discussed and committed to a plan for the 30th Anniversary celebrations. We are pleased to announce the following program of events and activities to celebrate this significant milestone for our Parish in the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn.

- ◆ Sunday 8 Oct 30th Anniversary Youth Mass and post Mass youth celebration (marking the beginning of a road to WYD 26). We hope to have this Mass and celebration supported by our Catholic schools.
- ♦ 9 -15 Oct Starting on Monday 9 Oct 23 we would have a week long effort to support businesses in our local community, especially parishioners owned and operated businesses. I look forward to hearing from parishioner's who own businesses in our local community.

- ♦ Saturday 14 Oct -
- * **5pm Multicultural Mass** to showcase our evolution as a Parish over the last 30 years. We are looking for our various parish community culture groups to reach out to express their support to participate in this Mass.
- * 6:30pm Parish 30th Anniversary party. More information on the party will come out in the next week or so. The information will include timings, catering arrangement, and ticketing arrangements.
- ♦ Sunday 15 Oct -
- * 8am Mass Seniors Mass and special blessing
- * 9:30am Mass Children and families Mass supported by our Catholic primary schools followed by a whole of Parish morning tea.
- * No 5pm Sunday Mass as we would like to see all of you at the other Masses over the weekend.

Time to reflect

Two or more

If your sister or brother should commit some wrong against you, go and point out the error, but keep it between the two of you. If she or he listens to you, you have won a loved one back; if not, try again, but take one or two others with you, so that every case may stand on the word of two or three witnesses. (Matthew 18: 15 - 16)



Jesus tells us that there is strength in numbers. Instead of stewing over the wrong someone did to you, you should meet with the person and discuss the problem. This advice applies to situations at work, at home, at school, or among your neighbours. One is not only a lonely number but a dangerous number because the more you replay perceived wrongs in your head, the easier it is to lose perspective and make matters worse by blowing up at someone.

Many managers (including a few parish/school leaders) seem to have the "if I just ignore it, it will go away" approach to problems. But how many of us have ever seen that approach actually work? Problems are meant to be solved and relationships reconciled. If two people can't do that, the next step is not to retreat but to try to advance with the aid of others (co-workers, family members, friends). If that fails, then it's time to call in the wider community for help: the human resources department, the entire family, the parish council. These are difficult steps, but they are meant to make rare a step that is all too common: complete disassociation from the offending party.

Two or more working together toward reconciliation discourages obstinate, isolating behaviour that leaves no room for anyone, not even God. Join the crowd today. www.gpbs.com.au
