

Keeping Vigil

(Matthew 25: 1 - 13)

For a few years I worked in downtown San Francisco. It's a lovely city by every standard, but it has one drawback that gives newcomers pause: it's located on an earthquake fault line. When you ask long-term residents how they cope with the idea that at any moment, without warning, their entire world could collapse under their feet, they look at you with the amusement of experience. "You get used to it," they tell you.

Most people who live on fault lines dismiss the odds. They don't have the emergency supplies on hand that local phone books recommend: enough bottled water for several days, torches, spare batteries, a transistor radio. To non-residents, this seems like madness. But consider all the things you may not be prepared for. How many people go through life without health insurance? Who prepares for divorce, disability, or unemployment? In some ways, we all go about without oil in our lamps, like the five in the story, playing the odds that we won't come up short.

One way to be prepared for any eventuality is to ground our lives, not in fluctuating circumstances, but in Christ. Though the earth shiver and crack open beneath us someday, we won't be lost if Christ is the bedrock upon which we stand.

What is the central truth upon which your life is grounded? Will that truth support you "come hell or high water"?

Pray

Grant us, O God, life in the light of faith, that we may be enlightened within, and bright and lively beacons without; that we may give illuminating and truthful witnesses to the brilliance of your grace and justice. This is our choice. Amen.

Ponder

Keep vigil for wisdom. Make time for spiritual reading regularly, as well as prayer, solitude, and worship. Get into the habit of discerning God's will as you make decisions regarding relationships and resources. "So stay alert. You have no idea when he might arrive".

Kids' Corner

Therefore stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour. (Matthew 25: 13)

Do you know what integrity is? Integrity is doing the right thing all the time, even when nobody is watching. It's doing the right thing simply because it's the right thing. That's not always easy. But God sees everything. God sees when we act with integrity and when we could do better. God isn't watching just so God can catch us slipping up. God really wants us to live with integrity. And God wants to help us, especially when it's hard.

Volunteer Opportunity - Parish Finance Council

The Parish is looking for a person to fill the role of Treasurer on the Parish Finance Council. The role of the PFC is to monitor the finances of the parish and advise the Parish Priest and Parish Pastoral Council on budgets, income, expenditure, future trends, and financial requirements.

This involves attending four meetings per year (roughly every three months). The meetings generally last about one and a half hours. There is a small amount of reading and email correspondence. Someone who has an understanding of income and expenditure statements and balance sheets would be desirable.



Please note that the role of Treasurer is assisted by the parish finance officer. He prepares the monthly financial statements, quarterly BAS, annual financial reports, annual budgets, meeting agendas and deals with various financial issues.

From the Council Chair - November Report

Let me begin by thanking all the parishioners for their commitment and contributions to the massive week of the 30th Anniversary celebrations. Without the full support of the parish, especially its volunteers, we would not have been able to mark this significant occasion.



As usual the Parish Pastoral Council met this week on Wednesday to discuss the Parish's next steps and oversee the operation of the Parish.

At the top of our issues was the recent advice from the Archdiocese that Parishes can recommence offering both forms of communion: the bread and the wine. The advice did not include the latest clinical advice from ACT Health and the Council agreed to source this advice before making any decisions. In the meantime, we would welcome the parishioners' views on introducing both forms of communion back in the parish to help inform any decisions.

We took the time to get an update from our Saint Francis Xavier community. The update was overwhelmingly positive from the small community. They have very proudly announced they will be celebrating Saint Francis Xavier's Feast Day in early December with a mass and twilight Parish picnic. There are more details on this event in this bulletin. I ask everyone in the Parish to save the date in the calendar and really think about joining our Saint Francis Xavier family for a twilight picnic. Also, you may wish to know that Saint Francis Xavier Church is the original location of the Gungahlin Parish dating back to 1910.

As many in the parish will know Christmas and the beginning of the liturgical year is upon us again. One minor complication for our Parish this year is the Good Shepherd School hall will be closed for renovations very soon. However, never fear Fr Troy and the Parish Office team are on to it and we will have a fantastic venue for Christmas Eve celebrations. More on this will come out in the next few weeks. It should be grand. Otherwise, Advent will again be a great Christmas preparation period for the Parish with the normal preparatory activities of lighting the church, activities for the kids to help decorate, and carols from our cultural communities. Your support and a little volunteering would be appreciated for these preparatory activities. Watch out in the bulletin for more information.



The Parish Council received a proposal to uplift and recognise our Altar Servers and recruit more from our most recent 1st communion flock. After discussion, the Council agreed to the proposal to launch that Guild of St Stephen and offer exclusive membership to the guild to our Altar Servers and new recruits. The Guild will offer training, fellowship and support for our Altar Serving community. In the coming weeks, this important sector in the Parish will receive exclusive invitations to the Guild.

The last item on our agenda was an update on our website and mobile app. Some interesting statistics from the discussion showed that our website has been visited over

16261 times in the last year and on average our app is being used 3.8 times a week by users. In the coming weeks, the Parish Council will be reaching out to collect your thoughts on the website and mobile app to gauge how best to refresh them both. Please have a think about how the website and mobile app work for you.

Finally, it is with sadness the Council said farewell and thank you to Jossy Rappai from the Council. After some time with the Council, she is standing down. We are grateful and thankful for her contributions to the Council, especially her keen intellect and vibrant approach to business. Thankfully, she is staying with us in the Parish where her enthusiasm will help light up our Church. Thank you, Jossy, for listening to the call to serve.


