#### Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord | Year B

#### This Is My Body

When we hear the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, we remember our Eucharist: Take, this is my body. But originally the words implied more than a ritual offering. Jesus offered his real flesh and blood to friends and persecutors alike. He surrendered his life in that hour. Nothing could be more generous, or more gentle. Yet those who seized his body and took his life were far from gentle. There is violence buried in the word "take." They took his body; and they slapped, spat at, mocked, whipped. pierced, and murdered him.

Today we look up at our sacrament and hear benevolent words: *This is my* body. The crucifix reveals the violence in those words, but all trace of it is gone from our bread and wine. What was sacrifice is now food. What was suffering is salvation. What was meant to destroy has become the source of life. Jesus died on the cross, but nothing was lost there. God gathered up the fragments of that great offering, and made eternal food. When we take the body of Jesus now, it is with great reverence.

# Consider you relationship to the sacrament of Eucharist. How has your understanding of it changed over time?

#### Pray

Deep Spirit, present within all things, we gather as a people, alive with hopes, fears, longings, joy, and weariness. We come in worship, we come in community, we come in expectant vulnerability. In peace, may we continue our Lenten journey from Lent into Holy Week. May worship be filled with a sense of wonder, a sense of fragile longing about the events to come, a sense of what it means to be part of our sacred humanity. In the spirit of Jesus we pray. Amen.

#### Ponder

Is your life consecrated to God's purposes? Let every moment of your day be a holy one. Give yourself, body and soul, to God in prayer, and experience the power of Eucharist. "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed?" Jesus said, "Yes, I am, and you'll see it yourself."

#### Kids' Corner

Morning after morning he opens my ear that I may hear. (Isaiah 50: 4)

When you woke up this morning, what did you hear? Birds chirping outside? Someone preparing breakfast? Sometimes sounds are so familiar, we hardly notice them. But sounds can be important, especially if they warn us of danger or teach us something new.

This week, as you hear the Sunday Gospel, listen to the sounds described: a jar of oil breaking, a rooster crowing, a crowd shouting, and then finally, silence. Think about these sounds this week, and pay attention to all you hear – especially the voices of people asking for help.

# Palm Sunday Rally – Justice for Refugees

On Sunday 24 March the annual Palm Sunday Rally for Refugees will be held in Garema Place, Canberra at 1pm. Members from Holy Spirit Parish will meet at the merry-go-round from 12.30pm. The rally will support the rights of refugees in Australia.

24 March is also the feast day of St Oscar Romero, who was martyred for his words and actions in support of social justice issues in his home country of El Salvador.

#### Why should you care about refugees?

Every Christian has a responsibility to care about the poor and downtrodden of society. People seeking asylum in Australia have often been threatened in their own countries in ways we would find hard to imagine in the relative safety of Australia.

They have often been persecuted because of their race, religion, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, resulting in the suffering of serious human rights violations, including torture or cruel, inhumane or degrading treatment or punishment.

The process for acceptance of refugee status in Australia for asylum seekers is incredibly slow. People are waiting for years. Many are still being held in detention. It isn't right.

#### What can you do?

Come along to the Palm Sunday Rally and join with members of the local Social Justice Group. If you can't attend the rally you could think about making a donation to the Australian Refugee Action Network <u>Australian Refugee Action Network ARAN</u> or Canberra Refugee Action Campaign <u>Refugee Action Campaign</u>, <u>Canberra (RAC) - Home</u> or the Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project <u>Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project - Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project (BASP)</u>

You can write to politicians, both government and non-government to ask them to do more to help refugees.

Don't forget that Jesus and the holy family were once refugees. According to the gospel of Matthew the holy family had to flee to Egypt to avoid the vengeance of Herod. So they were displaced from their home. It is also important to remember the words of Matthew (Matt 25:35) where the king separates the sheep from the goats and one of the criteria is "I was a stranger and you welcomed me". We need to be welcoming.
