God is Calling

Jesus can get pretty apocalyptic when describing the times and the danger. Every generation has its own multitude of dangers. So does each individual human life. In many ways unique to this generation, we're sitting on a limb being sawn off while we're depending on it. How much we actively participate in the sawing, of course, is up to us.

We can saw. Or we can become obedient. Obedience gets a bad reputation because it sounds too much like kowtowing to some authority which has, for all we know, rather questionable competence. If human authority is what we're talking about, that fear is justified. Worldly authority is routinely misused, so we hesitate to surrender our good judgement for something that may be far worse. But with Jesus, obedience is about freedom, not subjugation. The family he gathers around him may occasionally go out on a limb, but they won't be lost there.

Where do you see authority misused? Which sources of authority are you prepared to obey?

Kids' Corner

Jesus responded, "Who do you think are my mother and brothers?" Looking around, taking in everyone seated around him, he said, "Right here, right in front of you – my mother and my brothers. Obedience is thicker than blood. The person who obeys God's will is my brother and sister and mother." (Mark 3: 33 - 35)

Who is Jesus' mother? You know she is Mary. But Jesus' brothers? Who are they? Actually, Jesus did not have brothers because Mary did not have other children besides Jesus. The Greek word Saint Mark uses in the Gospel means close family members, such as cousins or stepbrothers. But this isn't really the point. Jesus says that those who listen and follow him are his family because they are doing his Father's will. Jesus wants us to be his family. He gives us the gift of Baptism, which makes us children of God. Baptism also gives us grace so we can follow Jesus. God gives us all this help because that's what families do.

Readings for 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Entrance Antiphon Psalm 26:1-2

The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?
The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread?
When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall.

First Reading | Genesis 3:9-15

The Lord God called to the man after he had eaten of the tree. 'Where are you?' he asked. 'I heard the sound of you in the garden;' he replied 'I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid.' 'Who told you that you were naked?' he asked. 'Have you been eating of the tree I forbade you to eat?' The man replied, 'It was the woman you put with me; she gave me the fruit, and I ate it.' Then the Lord God asked the woman, 'What is this you have done?' The woman replied, 'The serpent tempted me and I ate.'

Then the Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this,

'Be accursed beyond all cattle, all wild beasts. You shall crawl on your belly and eat dust every day of your life. I will make you enemies of each other: you and the woman, your offspring and her offspring. It will crush your head and you will strike its heel.'

Second Reading | 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, therefore I spoke - we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal. For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

Gospel | Mark 3:20-35

It is the end of Satan.

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him,' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house. 'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brothers now arrived and, standingoutside, sent in a message asking for him.

A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'


