Some scholars are fishermen, but it doesn't follow that all fishermen are scholars. Certainly, the guys who followed Jesus since Galilee didn't betray hours of brilliant learning. If they'd studied Scripture much, they might have recognised in Jesus' absolute control of the waters the divine authority displayed in the Old Testament. God sets limits on the waters in Genesis, and ever after the waters are under heavenly control. Think Noah and the ark, Moses and the Red Sea, Elijah and the long famine



without rain, Job and the Voice from the Whirlwind, Jonah and the great fish, to name a few. Only God can wield power over the forces of chaos represented by water. If Jesus could do it too, then logic would suggest that Jesus had a special relationship to God.

But we can't really blame the first disciples for not recognising the power of God when they were up to their necks in it. How often do astonishing events come into our lives, and we just say, "What luck!" or "How talented I am!" never acknowledging the true source of grace.

What events in your lifetime can only be attributed to the grace of God?

We are so often given over to fear, O God. Like the disciples we huddle together, swamped in spirit by the waves of life in their many different forms. For it is not as though there is nothing to be afraid of. And we need not pretend that faith puts an end to all doubt. It is simply that in those difficult and very human moments we do not reach out to you. We do not seek the reassurance and calm that you are so willing to give. Hear then our cry for healing; hear in our hearts our longing for calming peace. (pause) Amen.

Ponder

God makes all things possible: life, love, beauty, hope. Resolve to live more gratefully, giving praise and thanks to God for every good thing that comes your way. He included everyone in his death so that everyone could also be included in his life, a resurrection life.

Kids' Corner

So, whoever is in Christ is a new creation. (2 Corinthians 5: 17)

There's practically nothing better than waking up and remembering that it's school holidays. You've got a couple of weeks ahead of you. You can play with friends, go to the park, read books, go to the movies, ride your bike or just sit and do nothing. This is actually good for you because when you go back to school, you can feel refreshed – like a whole new creation. But don't think about going back to school just yet. Right now, think about the holidays ahead – and how you can keep Jesus by your side.



A Day To Recognise Widows

Losing a spouse or partner can be devasting. For couples that have been together for many years the loss of a loved one can be especially painful.

In recognition of widows, International Widows' Day is held each year on June 23. It is a day of action to address the poverty and injustice faced by millions of widows and their dependents in countries around the world". The United Nations says the main goal of the day is to create awareness about the condition of widows and protect their rights.

However, we can all play our part when dealing with someone who has lost their soulmate.

Things to remember when dealing with someone's grief. Widows needs a space to freely express their emotions, fears, and memories, so it is important to avoid offering unsolicited advice or attempting to "fix" their grief. Instead, be encouraging and ask them to share

their thoughts and experiences. You can be a listening ear and be a big support.



The United Nations has observed International Widows Day since 2011, to "draw attention to the voices and experiences of widows and to galvanize the unique support that they need".

The UN website claims there are about 258 million widows around the world, and nearly one in ten live in



extreme poverty. In some parts of eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo, for example, it is reported that a staggering 50 per cent of women are widows.

The UN remembrance for widows began with the work of Rajinder Paul Loomba, a philanthropist, founder and executive chairman of clothing company Loomba Group. He is recognised for his fundraising on behalf of widowhood in the developing world. His mother, Shrimati Pushpa Wati Loomba, was widowed at the age of 37 in India.

Entrance Antiphon | Psalm 27:8,9

The Lord is the strength of his people, a saving refuge for the one he has anointed. Save your people, Lord, and bless your heritage, and govern them for ever.

First Reading | Job 38:1.8-11

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:

Who pent up the sea behind closed doorswhen it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

Responsorial Psalm | Ps 106:23-26. 28-31. R. v.1

(R.) Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting.

- Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters.
 These men have seen the Lord's deeds, the wonders he does in the deep. (R.)
- 2. For he spoke; he summoned the gale, tossing the waves of the sea up to heaven and back into the deep; their soul melted away in their distress. (R.)

Second Reading | 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Gospel | Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care?' We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
