For Pity's Sake

Jesus said, "Come away by yourselves; let's take a break and get a little rest" ... So they got in the boat and went off to a remote place by themselves. Someone saw them going and the word got around. From the surrounding towns people went out on foot, running, and got there ahead of them. When Jesus arrived, he saw a huge crowd. At the sight of them, his heart broke – like sheep with no shepherd. He went right to work teaching them. (Mark 6: 31a, 32 - 34)

So the disciples went off two by two, preaching and healing and scaring off demons. And when they returned, the great works they'd performed came back to haunt them: people wouldn't leave them alone! It's called success, and it only leads to more work. Finally, Jesus drew his starving disciples aside to grab a bite and a chance to rest. But the deserted place didn't stay deserted for long. Pretty soon a crowd had formed, dog-eyed at the dinner table, begging for scraps.

Jesus looked out at that needy sea of faces and felt heartbroken. He might have been annoyed and frustrated, but his response was what you'd expect from God: love-compelled. Deprived of hope, broken in body, mind and heart, plagued by evil, crowds hounded the healers because the need was so great and the possibility of help so rare. They wanted relief. They wanted a reason to believe. And so Jesus taught them. And because nothing much has changed in the world for two thousand years, the church teaches still.

How can the teaching mission of the church feed the hunger of the world?

Pray

God, we pray for the gift of place – a space where we may experience your presence, where we may attend to the needs of others and ourselves, where we may rest, and where we may serve. For in such a place do we find life and hope, now and always. Amen.

Ponder

Become a good shepherd to those around you. Be a reconciler, exercise generosity, teach by your example of patience and kindness. The Cross got us to embrace, and that was the end of hostility.

Kids' Corner

Jesus said, "Come away by yourselves; let's take a break and get a little rest." (Mark 6: 31)

The rest you get at night is important for your health. When you get enough sleep, you wake up with energy for the day. You can think clearly and work and play hard. With sleep, many things come together for good.

The same is true of our relationship with God. We need to rest in God. Jesus knew this. That's why he invites us to take time each day to be quiet and talk to God. With prayer, many things can come together for good. Try it today.

Loving God, give me quiet time with you today. Amen.

First Reading | Jeremiah 23:1-6

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The remnant of the flock I will gather to me, and bring them back to their pastures.

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. Finance Update (6 Months)

Parish Financial Facts That We Need To Be Aware Of That Are Highlighted In The Statistics Below

With declining mass attendances and the reduction in the number of Planned Givers and Pledged Amounts, the "glory" years of the past, where we achieved surpluses of over \$100,000, have truly vanished. As we move from a time of newly constructed buildings to entering the cycle of replacement, repairs and maintenance, we can expect ongoing substantial expenditure in this area for many years to come.

Overall, our income is above budget for the year, with planned giving increased due to a few new contributors and the growing use of the EFTPOS machines. Other, smaller sources of income, such as the Piety Stall, are providing some additional income. Expenditure is below budget for the year to date, primarily due to the departure of the parish secretary and the delay in appointing a replacement. Delays in planned capital expenditure have been offset by increased repairs and maintenance. Along with the rising cost of living we all face, we continue to incur higher expenses in the next quarter. Overall, we have an operating surplus for the moment.

A couple of things I learnt is that **Lids for Kids** would like us to **separate** the blister packs into those that are 100% aluminum and those that are aluminum with plastic.









100% aluminum

50% aluminum/50% plastic

The lids that **Lids for Kids** collect to make furniture etc are – milk, soft-drink and water bottle lids only. Please remove and discard the foam insert. All are to be CLEAN and DRY.

Lids for Kids also collect lids that have plastic inside and push-pull lids. They give these to schools for craft etc. E-waste

E-waste items include small electrical items including coiled cables, accessories and devices (please reset to factory settings).

Help Needed – it would be great if we could have helpers present at every Mass on Sustainability Sunday (weekend). All it requires is for you to be at Mass about 15 minutes before Mass begins and about 10 minutes after Mass to help people who want to make donations and to answer questions. We are trying to share the load and to make this easy for everyone involved.
