Nothing Will Be Wasted

It's not a fair comparison, I grant you: but Elisha fed a hundred people with twenty loaves, and Jesus fed 5,000 with five loaves. If you do the math, it explains why people were even more anxious to follow Jesus. Plus, there are the inexplicable twelve baskets left over at the end of the meal that Jesus orchestrated. No wonder they wanted to carry him off and make him king.

But Jesus didn't come to regulate the economy of Israel or to provide welfare-to-work programs. He didn't come to set up a medical clinic or to treat mental illness. Though Jesus does feed some of the hungry and heal some of the sick, by no means did he put an end to suffering in his time or for all time. He left that challenge up to his followers. Jesus simply presents himself as the source of divine abundance and invites us to come to the table and eat. This table's been serving meals for two thousand years, billions have been fed, and there's no end in sight to the feast.

What kind of hunger do you bring to the Eucharist? How have you been fed?

Pray

God of overflowing grace, we admit those times when we are timid to offer what we have, when we feel our gifts may be too small to make a difference, or when we belittle the offerings of others. Forgive us when we lack faith. There are times, too, when we are afraid to step forward, when we do not encourage others, when we do not dare, or risk, or trust. Forgive us when we lack faith. And there are times when we believe we know all that can be known and will not open ourselves to the wondrous possibilities of the love and grace you make known to us in Christ Jesus. Forgive us when we lack faith. Amen.

Ponder

Reflect on the way a good meal satisfies; food, drink, atmosphere, conversation, company. Maybe even candles and flowers. Compare that meal with the Eucharistic meal we share. Celebrate a holy communion each time you share a meal. *You were all called to travel on the same road and in the same direction, so stay together, both outwardly and inwardly.*

Kids' Corner

Hear the Word of the Lord ... (Jeremiah 7: 2)

Jeremiah was a prophet who lived hundreds of years before Jesus came. Jeremiah shared the words that God spoke to him. He called people to turn back to God and do the right thing in their lives.

You hear God speaking in your life when you go to Mass. When you hear the lector, deacon or priest say the words "the word of the Lord" and "the Gospel of the Lord," you can know that it is truly God speaking to you right where you are. When you next go to Mass, pay close attention to the words you hear in the readings. What is God saying to you?

Loving God, open my heart to hear you speaking in my life. Amen.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 2024

The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is celebrated each year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. This year the day will be celebrated on Sunday 28 July.



World Day

The celebration of this special day was established by Pope Francis in 2021 to cherish the contributions made by grandparents and the elderly and to remind us not to neglect them in their old age. This year's theme is "Do not cast me off in my old age".

Celebrating the role of grandparents and the elderly in our community is a good and worthwhile thing in any event, but this year the Pope has granted a plenary indulgence to people who participate in the various functions that will be held throughout the world on 28 July, or who devote time to actually or virtually visiting their elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the lonely, the disabled).

What is an indulgence?

Indulgences have been widely misunderstood in the Church for some time, such misunderstandings have also led to their misuse in the past. However, they are gifts from God's mercy given to us through the Church in virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary and the Saints and we do well to understand these gifts and open ourselves to receive them! The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes indulgences as the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven (c.f. CCC 1471). As Catholics we know that God's Mercy is so great that no sin is beyond his forgiveness for those who return to his loving embrace. We also know that our sins damage us and have consequences even after we have been forgiven. When we pray for our departed loved ones we are praying for those who may be undergoing a final purification before they are admitted to the full happiness of heaven, this final purification is the consequence or "temporal punishment" due to sins committed in their lifetime.

An indulgence then, is a release from the consequences of sin and can be gained for one's own sake or for the sake of the holy souls in Purgatory. Indulgences are partial or plenary according as they remove either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. To obtain these incredible favours for ourselves or our departed loved ones, certain good works are required of us:

Conditions for an indulgence

The general conditions are:

- ◆ Detachment from any sins;
- ◆ attend sacramental confession;
- ◆ Receive Eucharistic communion, and;
- ◆ Pray for the intentions of the Pope.

For the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly a person would also be expected to:

- ◆ Participate in one of the various functions that will be held throughout the world on 28 July, or;
- ◆ Devote adequate time to actually or virtually visiting their elderly brothers or sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the lonely, the disabled).

So think about celebrating this Sunday. You might bring your parents or grandparents along to Mass with you. Or you could visit grandparents or someone else you know and maybe share a cup of coffee or a meal, but mainly let them know they aren't forgotten. If your grandparents don't live close by you might give them a phone call or set up a virtual meeting. There are lots of possibilities.

*Heavenly Father, bless our grandparents and all the elderly with health and happiness.
May their wisdom guide us and their love surround us.
Grant them peace and joy, and may we honour and cherish them always. Amen.*

Gospel | John 6:1-15

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

Finance Update (6 Months)

Parish Financial Facts That We Need To Be Aware Of That Are Highlighted In The Statistics Below

With declining mass attendances and the reduction in the number of Planned Givers and Pledged Amounts, the "glory" years of the past, where we achieved surpluses of over \$100,000, have truly vanished. As we move from a time of newly constructed buildings to entering the cycle of replacement, repairs and maintenance, we can expect ongoing substantial expenditure in this area for many years to come.

Overall, our income is above budget for the year, with planned giving increased due to a few new contributors and the growing use of the EFTPOS machines. Other, smaller sources of income, such as the Piety Stall, are providing some additional income. Expenditure is below budget for the year to date, primarily due to the departure of the parish secretary and the delay in appointing a replacement. Delays in planned capital expenditure have been offset by increased repairs and maintenance. Along with the rising cost of living we all face, we continue to incur higher expenses in the next quarter. Overall, we have an operating surplus for the moment.
