Poor in the World, Rich in Faith

A young man got up to speak at the local university prayer gathering last week. At first, I thought he was speaking a language unknown to me; then gradually I realised he was speaking my language. But his ability to make himself understood was nearly strangled by an impediment that made him repeat himself in a loop, over and over, until he could complete a single sentence. I felt sad and frustrated for him.

When he finished speaking, an attractive young woman translated his message for him, emphasising his main points. And the group of people cheered his name, over and over. I realised that this young man, though impaired, was practically a cult figure among his peers. They knew him, liked him, accepted him. Though his tongue was bound, his spirit was free.

Many of us labour under impediments to love that seem insurmountable. They may be physical, mental, or spiritual in nature, rooted in past injury or present dysfunction. However impossible it seems that we may be freed from what holds us bound, the appearance is deceiving. Jesus cured the deaf mute with his spirit. He holds the power to open hearts too.

We will seek a more understanding and compassionate world.** And so now may the love of God, the grace and generosity of Jesus, and the abiding friendship of the Spirit be with us now and evermore. **Amen!**

Ponder

Embrace downward mobility in the world, upward mobility in the Kingdom. Find ways to share what you have with the materially or spiritually poor. *Isn't it clear by now that God operates quite differently?*

Where is God when it's dark and stormy at night? Where is God when we are worried about someone we love? Where is God when we are scared to try something new? God is always with us. God is here now. God is in every here and every now. When you feel afraid, try this: Close your eyes, take a deep breath and imagine the love of God wrapping you up like a blanket. Remind yourself that God is with you, no matter what.

Week 2 of the Season of Creation | Creation is groaning

In his Canticle of Creatures, St Francis of Assisi referred to the Earth as our sister and mother.

In Romans 8:22 there is a biblical image that pictures the Earth as a mother, groaning as in childbirth. We need to listen to the cry of the Earth and the cry of the Poor. These cries bemoan the destructive actions causing the climate crisis, loss of biodiversity and human suffering as well.

And it is no wonder that the Earth and the Poor are crying when you consider the most recent report of the World Meteorological Organisation – State of the Global Climate 2023. This report notes that:

- 2023 was the warmest year on record;
- Greenhouse gases reached record high levels;
- Ocean heat reached its highest level in the 65 year observational record;
- Global mean sea level reached a record high;
- Antarctic sea-ice extent fell to a record low;
- Extreme weather, by way of heatwaves, cyclones, wildfires and flooding led to loss of life, the destruction of homes and large-scale air pollution across the world;
- Food security, population displacement and impacts on vulnerable populations were of mounting concern, with weather and climate hazards exacerbating the situation in many parts of the world.

This is a pretty depressing report in many ways, but as we celebrate the Season of Creation we must have hope for change to occur. There is a phrase commonly attributed to St Augustine that says "Hope has two beautiful daughters; their names are Anger and Courage. Anger at the way things are, and Courage to see that they do not stay as they are."

Maybe we can have a righteous anger that gives us the courage to be hopeful and active for change. If we can do that, while we may not be around to see it, our grandchildren will be grateful to us one day.

There are things we can all do to make a difference and over the next few weeks we will look at some of those practical things.

Entrance Antiphon | Cf Psalm 85:3,5

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

First Reading | Deuteronomy 4:1-2. 6-8

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

You may add nothing to the word which I speak to you – keep the commands of the Lord.

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you today, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Keep them, observe them, and they will demonstrate to the peoples your wisdom and understanding. When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? And what great nation is there that has laws and customs to match this whole Law that I put before you today?'

Be doers of the word.

It is all that is good, everything that is perfect, which is given us from above; it comes down from the Father of all light; with him there is no such thing as alteration, no shadow of a change. By his own choice he made us his children by the message of the truth so that we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that he had created.

Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. But you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves.

Pure, unspoilt religion, in the eyes of God our Father is this: coming to the help of orphans and widows when

they need it, and keeping oneself uncontaminated by the world.

Gospel | Mark 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

You forget the commandments of God and hold on to human tradition.

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'
