

Ransom for Many

While Jesus is talking about becoming ransom, his followers are looking for glory. No wonder Jesus groans that they don't know what they're talking about. Of the four gospel writers, Mark is most likely to draw the disciples as out-and-out dumbbells. Since it's the first of the gospels to be written down, Mark's depiction is likely closer to the truth than the other evangelists cared to be.

Alas, these dumbbells are closer to revealing our natural inclinations than we care to admit. We step up to drink the cup of Christ in our Eucharist without much fuss, but when it comes time to share his passion in even the smallest sense, we don't respond to roll call. We're willing to take part in the rituals of religion, but we're nowhere to be found when it's time to be ransom. Servant-hood has little appeal. Still we're prepared to join in the finger-pointing at James and John seeking credit. We, at least, cover our aspirations a little better than they do.

When was the last time you paid the price, so that another could go free?

Pray

Patient God, we have so many questions. We demand things, and often want to know where the path will lead before we set out. Set our hearts to rest and remind us that life is made up of more questions than answers, and that's okay. Amen.

Ponder

Choose to be the servant who lifts up another. Avoid the limelight. Seek the dirty job. Give anonymously. Be generous with credit. Crave humility. "The Son of Man came to serve, not to be served – and then to give away his life in exchange for many who are held hostage."

Kids' Corner

He came to serve, not to be served – and then to give away his life in exchange for many who are held hostage. (Mark 10: 45)

Lisa likes to be first: first in line, first to be picked for teams and first to take a turn. As long as she is first, she doesn't really care who is second, third or last. But Jesus teaches us that greatness isn't about being first; it's about serving others. If we focus less on ourselves, we will see more ways to help others.

Jesus, show me how I can put someone first today. Amen.

Gospel | Mark 10:35-45


James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'







What the Parish Survey told us

Dear Parishioners

We promised to share the results of our survey with you. Here is the first, general summary. There is so much more to examine but the storey is rich and interesting.

- 1. Nearly 500 parishioners responded a truly wonderful, generous and validating response.
- 2. The response pattern reflects what we know of the makeup of the parish:
 - More female that male (60/40)
 - Most of us are between 36-50 years old and 51-70. A heroic 15% of responders were aged between 19 and 35.
 - We are evenly split between those born in Australia and those born overseas, those from the Philippines strongly represented.
- 3. Most of those who responded come to Mass frequently, but 20% do not and we will learn a lot from both responses.
- 4. Over half of us (55%) have children living with us.






5. Positive Experiences of Parish?

The three top positive experiences:

- celebrating Mass,
- receiving the sacraments, and
- enjoying our style of worship and music.
- 6. Most people saw no barriers to their participation in the parish, but for those who did, the issues were:
 - time,
 - adequate information/communication, and
 - physical access to the church buildings.

7. What can we improve?

The strongest response, at 41%, was 'no response', which we are interpreting as a generally positive endorsement of the way we worship and organise!!

- 8. For the other 60%, there was a strong desire for:
 - change or diversity in the STYLE of worship and music
 - similarly with the homily and sermons,
 - along with building a stronger parish community.
- 9. Answers to how to implement our priorities of spiritual growth, a stronger community with a welcoming environment and nurturing of our volunteers were varied. But the consistent message was to allow and encourage the laity to take more responsibility and action across the board in the Parish.
- 10. The most common practical suggestions for improvement were:
 - More bible study opportunities, Eucharistic adoration, and pilgrimages
 - More and better welcoming, especially at Mass, more social functions, revival family/parish groups and finding opportunities for people to mingle, especially single people.
 - Walking beside newcomers, always around 20% of Mass attendees.
 - Nurture our volunteers through broader ministry opportunities, training and personal invitation.

HOW ARE WE GOING TO RESPOND?

There are some things we can do now, others that need more understanding, and a number of more complex issues which we will need to discern and discuss at our own parish assembly in early 2025.

- 1. Right now, we are conducting another Alpha program which embraces spiritual growth, warm welcome and community.
- 2. We will revive and build the welcome ministry to expand Mass welcome, partnering with newcomers, and parish hospitality.
- 3. We will also see where and when we can put on more gatherings.
- 4. We will put out the call for leaders of bible study groups and try to offer a diversity of times and content.
- 5. We will start conducting focus groups on more nuanced issues, such as: what do we really mean when we want changes to the STYLE of the Mass or the music? This will take time and discernment.
- 6. And then, next year, at our parish assembly, together we will consider all we have learned and how we have responded. And we will plan our future together.

A Radical Message

There are many symbols that reflect our society, some for better and others for worse. The professional athlete is one of those symbols that seems to endure generation after generation. Children look up to them. Weet-Bix still puts them on their cereal boxes. And all the sports channels give interview after interview. They become our heroes, to be emulated and imitated.

What does it say, then, when athletes are found with corked baseball bats or steroids or illegal golf clubs? It tells us that we live in a society that

condones winning no matter what the cost, the importance of being 'Number 1' over simply doing your best, that being guilty only happens when you get caught. And we shrug it off, saying that this is just the way things are

It is no wonder that young and impressionable people have become so incredibly competitive and the rest of us jaded that nothing surprises us anymore.

The gospel of Jesus stands as a strong counterpoint to the message that is being given. The gospel tells us that we must put others first, put their needs ahead of our own, not worry about who is No. 1.
