The Time of Distress

Some of us respond quicker to bad news than to good. That's how the news media manages to garner our attention. Dire headlines grab eyeballs. We're conditioned to respond to the bad, because the consequences of not responding can be costly.

Jesus does deliver some bad news in the gospels. Make no mistake: this world is passing, and it's all going away for each of us personally and for all creation eventually. We can't hang our hopes on the sun, moon, and stars, because even these mighty forces are mere creatures with built-in obsolescence. And if we're willing to hedge our bets about the end of the world, wagering that our time will not see the end-time, then we're still left to comfort our own mortality in the mirror every morning. Some days we may feel invincible, but you don't want to found your future on a feeling.

Because gospel means good news, the message can never end on a dire note. Creation's last chapter is coming, but the words of Jesus belong to eternity. If we're looking for an escape route through inescapable death and destruction, Jesus is the door.

How do the words of Jesus bring new life to you?

Pray

God of our life, impatiently we stamp our feet, yelling "now!" Yet empty, we are filled with your life; desperate, we are gifted with your hope; unable to see your future, you open our eyes to faith. May it be in the waiting that we find you. Amen.

Ponder

You may be in a time of distress right now or know someone who is. Seek the avenue of hope and life, and share your strength in faith with someone else. "Sky and earth will not wear out; my words won't wear out. But the exact day and hour? No one knows that."

Kids' Corner

When we take part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we tell Jesus our sins through the priest. When we come in sorrow for our sins and do the penance given to us by the priest, we are forgiven by God. Our sins are forgiven forever. They are gone. The weight is off our shoulders. Our job now is to avoid committing those sins again. God gives us graces in the sacrament to strengthen us, but it's still up to us to do the work.

Take part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation whenever you can. It is God's loving way of helping you grow into the best person you can be.

PPC Update

- ♦ The parish is looking forward to a great get together at its Christmas Festival on Saturday 7 December, from 4pm to 8pm. It's a nice, relaxed way for us to catch up with each other before Christmas. The Festival is an immediate response to the September parish survey.
- Nearly 500 parishioners responded to the survey and one of two major themes was the desire to gather as a community more often. The other key message was a strong need to develop our own faith and spirituality, especially through bible study and faith formation.
- As a result we are running a short 'bible study" group for Advent, reviewing the Mass readings each week. They will be held in the parish rooms each Saturday at 10.00 am, starting on November 30. More information on the results of the survey can be found on our website: Holy Spirit Catholic Parish—Serving the Community of Gungahlin and the Pocket Parish App.
- As promised the parish will now be conducting focus groups on key topics which emerged from the survey and which need more thought and discernment. These include: Welcome and Inclusion across all aspects of parish, Music and Liturgy; and Our Volunteers, their recruitment, training and formation, nurture and our appreciation. Everyone will be welcome and we will advertise the focus groups extensively.
- ◆ 20 people from our parish attended the Archdiocesan Assembly on 18 October. We joined more than 550 people from across the Archdiocese, gathering as a family for the first time in 20 years to consider the big three themes: Encounter, Discipleship and Mission. An excellent report of the Assembly can be found at: <u>Archdiocesan Assembly Response – CG Evangeli-sation</u> It is well worth the read and will help guide our thinking on our own Parish Assembly in March next year.
- ♦ We see the Parish Assembly as our chance to gather as a parish family to focus on our Mission and how we go forth together. So, there is much to look forward to as we approach Advent and a new liturgical year.

Entrance Antiphon | Jeremiah 29:11,12,14

The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction.

You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place.

First Reading | Daniel 12:1-3

'At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'



New Liturgical Year and New Opportunities

As we approach advent and the new church liturgical year, I would like to take the opportunity to bring back, refine and update a few liturgical practices and the look and feel of our church. Starting from the First Sunday of Advent (weekend 30 November-1 December) the following will be introduced.

♦ Holy Communion: Communion under both species will be offered at every Mass. There will be two chalices available. Parishioners will now receive Holy Communion via the middle aisle only and move towards the chalice closest to their side if they wish before returning to their seat. See diagram below.



- **Readers:** There will be a seat available at the sanctuary for the readers who are waiting their turn to sit and listen to God's word.
- Readers: The Prayer of the faithful with will now be read from the Ambo (where the reading are done). All other notices and Mass Welcome to remain at the lectern below.
- Offertory Procession: This has been simplified to include the Wine Carafe, 2 bowls with hosts and the money plate. Parishioners are encouraged to participate in the offertory procession.
- Changes to the church: You may notice some changes taking place with the look and feel of the church during advent. We welcome your feedback and thoughts, however please be patient as it will be a slow work in progress.
